"I've Been Wondering..." FAQs about Worship

Why do we stand for some prayers and sit for others?

Unlike a movie or sporting event that we go to watch, worship is a highly participatory activity, through which we enact the Gospel (good news) of God's love for all creation. To that end, worship leaders don't "do" worship for the benefit of an audience (congregation). Rather, pastors, liturgists, the choir and other musicians serve to facilitate the congregation's worship.

In Jesus the Christ, the Word became "flesh" assuming the fullness of our humanity as Mary's child. So Jesus is God's eternal "Yes" to all that we are in the flesh. Our worship, therefore, honors the human senses and involves the whole of ourselves, body, mind and spirit. Through sight, smell, sound, touch and taste, we come (no less than through cognitive function) to apprehend the presence of the Holy One who is Emmanuel, God "with-us."

Sitting, kneeling, standing, lying prostrate (stretched out on the ground face down) are all postures for prayer that facilitate communication with God. As individuals, some of these postures are more conducive to our prayers than others. Standing for prayer suggests heightened attention, anticipation and expectation. While standing, some choose to hold ones arms in front with palms facing up, as an expression of being open to God and ready to receive back from God. Of course, one's circumstances may make a particular prayer posture difficult (if not impossible), and so less conducive to participating in the prayer as intended. Like the whole of our worship, each part of the liturgy—and its accompanying posture—is meant as a gift to be received as a way foster and facilitate an encounter with God. While we encourage worshipers to stretch themselves beyond their comfort zones, no one ought to feel coerced into participating in any particular act of worship for which he or she is not ready.

All that being said, if sitting or standing (or kneeling or lying prostrate) is most conducive to your prayers, do that! God will be honored by it!

What if I feel moved to receive Communion, but am not baptized?

The Lord's Supper and Baptism are inseparable. If you feel called by the Holy Spirit to meet Christ in Communion, we believe that you are also being called to Baptism. We will not turn anyone away from the Lord's Table, but we do invite you to speak to the pastor or a member of the session about Baptism as soon as possible.
