#### \*THE NICENE CREED



# COMMUNION OF THE PEOPLE

D In the tradition of the Presbyterian Church, the Lord's Supper is open to all who have been baptized with the "Triune formula" (...in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit), regardless of the particular Christian tradition (denomination) in which the baptism was administered. All the baptized may come to the Table at the center and return by the outside aisles. You may take the bread, dip it into the chalice and partake of both together, or you may partake of the bread and then proceed to partake of the juice from the tray of individual cups. Gluten-free bread is available with Pastor James from the plate in his left hand.




