A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR...



January always brings with it something of a fresh start. At the end of the year we look back on all that has happened and we take stock of our lives. At the beginning of a new year we look forward to all we expect to encounter and all we hope to accomplish. Many people make

New Years' resolutions to do this or that, quit bad habits or try to become better disciplined in one way or another. Whatever that might mean for you, I wish you well.

You may know that at the end of most services of worship I pronounce a "Blessing & Charge." The "charge" often goes something like this: "Go in peace, each of you to your own ministries." Upon leaving worship not long ago, one of you asked me what I mean by "ministry," as in, "... each to your own ministries." I explained that "ministry" simply means "service." As Presbyterians, we believe in the doctrine of the priesthood of all believers and part of what that means is that our baptism is our ordination to the Christian life, which involves service (ministry) to others in God's name. Each of us is born with particular gifts and skills to offer the world. These are given to us by God to be used as a part of our discipleship, our following after Jesus who shows us how to live and how to love. In this sense we are all "priests" serving others in God's name. As the Apostle Peter tells us in his first letter, "you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light" (1 Peter 2:9). The exact nature of our service may well change from time to time depending upon where we find ourselves and what the particular need is, but make no mistake about it, as Christians, we are all called to ministry. Loving God and neighbor is a full-time job. It is our calling, our vocation.

My hope and prayer for you in this new year is that you might reflect more deeply upon just how God is calling you to use your gifts and skills to make God's love real for all people. In other words, I encourage you to discover and claim your own ministry in 2013. If you would like to talk more about this, I would welcome hearing from you.

While baptism ordains us all to the ministry of loving God and neighbor, it also provides for some within the church to be called to the specific ministries of service as ruling elders, teaching elders (pastors) or deacons. I am excited about a new class of ruling elders and deacons that will begin their service upon their ordination and/or installation at the 11:00 a.m. service on Sunday, January 10, 2016. I am grateful for the following who have answered the call to service as ruling elders and deacons in and for the church. On the Session (Elders): Sam Connor (youth, one-year term), Bryan Eikmann, Kathy Gibbs (reelected to serve another term), Cindy Martin, Del Phillips, and Rick Waldo. On the Diaconate (Deacons): Mark Besselman, Kelley Hurrell, Bill Irvine, Martha Lamey, and Chris Truett. These new church leaders bring with them a wealth of experience in the life of the church as well as a deep commitment to the spiritual life of the church!

With that, there are some currently serving elders and deacons who will be ending their terms of service. These elders have served New Hope and the larger church well and their leadership has steered New Hope through some significant changes in our life together. I am grateful for their faithful service and New Hope is blessed for their leadership.


