MUSIC NOTES

Today's hymn *O Worship the King, All Glorious Above*, was written by Sir Robert Grant. He was born in India in 1779, son of the director of the East India Company. He studied law at Oxford and at the age of 29 won a seat in Parliament. Deeply concerned with social issues, he made efforts to pass a bill which removed certain restrictions on Jewish citizens of England. He returned to India as the governor of Bombay, holding that position for four years until his death in 1838.
