Signs of (New Life) at New Hope

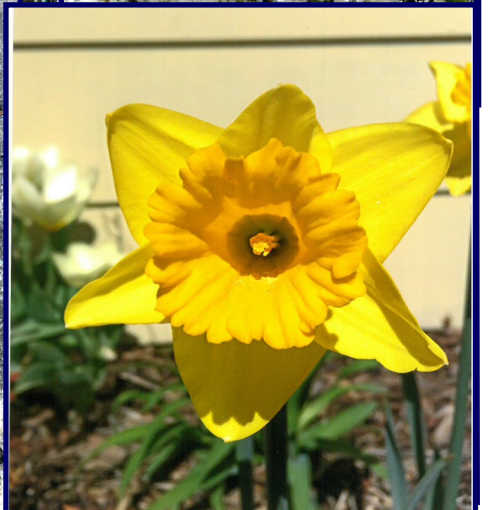
The stone is rolled away. The tomb is empty. During this Eastertide, we encourage you to look for signs of resurrection, of new life.

The Journey, Wrap Up and Review

As I reflect over the last four and a half months being one of the small group leaders of *The Journey*, I am struck by just how much I have grown during this time. The whole purpose of *The Journey* is to live into the promise of our baptism and what and how that might look for each of us. But, oh my goodness!! It is sooo much more!

Is *The Journey* about **fellowship**? You betcha!! And fellowship happens in so many different ways. We share a meal together and each of the small groups have taken turns providing for the large group. During lunch, we've had the chance to catch up with what's been happening with our small group folks over the week and an opportunity to get to know the rest of *The Journey's* participants, as well. In the small groups, we've established relationships and a level of trust that allows us to speak from the heart and soul. We laugh, we cry, we support, we challenge and, best of all, we care about one another. (Each small group has about eight participants – both travelers and companions. For the most part, each small group participant did not know a whole lot about the other participants prior to beginning *The Journey*, so it's been an opportunity to get to know and love people with whom we might not otherwise have gotten to know and care about.) It's developing and maintaining these amazing relationships that makes *The Journey* so powerful.

Is *The Journey* about **faith formation**? Oh, yeah!! With few exceptions, we have studied Biblical scriptures – generally, a gospel reading from the lectionary. We delve deeply into how the passage touches us and what meaning it has for our lives. And then, we explore what God is calling us to be or do as it applies to the scripture. Sometimes this is difficult, but with the encouragement and support of the small group, we are learning how to live as disciples each day and every moment of our lives. It's in the sharing of our faith and living into the gospel that we feel more comfortable telling the story of Christ in our own lives.

Is *The Journey* about **healing**? Certainly!! Healing takes many forms and comes in a variety of ways. It is interesting to notice that when 'I' is replaced by 'We', "illness" becomes "wellness." What we are learning to do is to share God's grace and healing love with each other. Sometimes, it's enough for us just to be there for each other. Each week we pray for one another and extend a hand of comfort.

Is *The Journey* about **mission and service**? Oh, most assuredly!! The last several weeks of *The Journey* have been all about living into our baptism through service within and outside the congregation and community. It's not about fulfilling ourselves, but it IS all about choosing to serve in some way as a faithful response to a loving God who has sacrificed everything for us. As we have begun to explore our individual gifts, we are finding ways to use them in service to others.

Is *The Journey* about **respect**? Absolutely!! As we have taken time to get to know and appreciate one another, we have developed trust and respect that far surpasses anything we've experienced before. We respect each other's faith journey; and, through really listening to each other, we have discovered that our journeys are so very different from one another. We have learned each other's differences and celebrated that our faith is manifested in many ways – different, yet faithful to the scripture and teachings of Christ. Open-mindedness not only allows us to accept each other's differences, but embrace those differences, as well.

As I reread this, I realize that words cannot express the depth and magnitude that this experience has afforded me. While each of the things I've mentioned above is accurate, *The Journey* is so much more than the sum of these parts. It's been an outstanding experience – one in which I hope each and every one of our

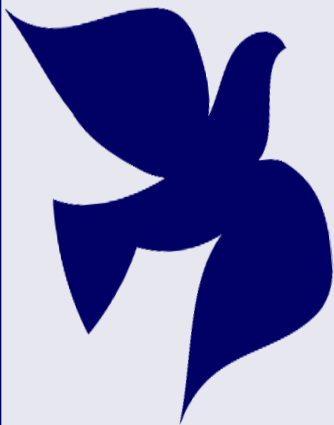

G-Force: God's Love in Action

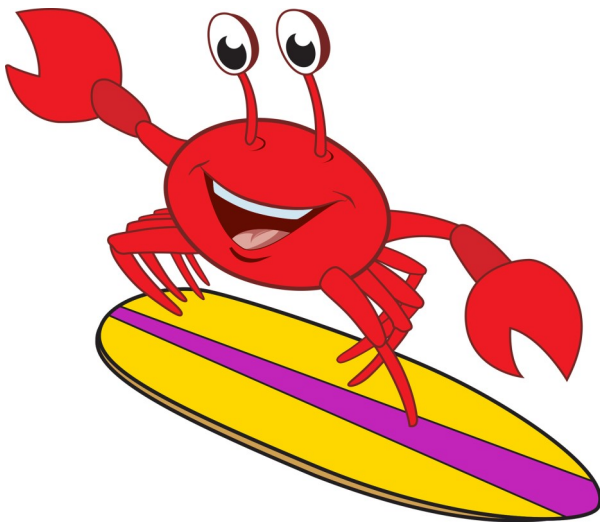
July 11 - July 15 ~ 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM
