# **During Today's Worship**

# Breaking of the Bread Communion of the People

© Coming to the Table—Ushers will invite worshipers to the Lord's Table by rows. All the baptized may come to the Table at the center and return by the outside aisles.

© Receiving the elements—You may take the bread, dip it into the chalice and partake of both together (intinction), or you may partake of the bread first, and then proceed to partake of the juice separately from the tray of individual cups. Gluten-free bread is available with Pastor James from the plate in his left hand.

\$\infty\$ After the presider and communion servers have received the elements, and before the concluding prayer, the whole assembly is invited to share a moment of silent contemplation before God.

They participated in a workshop titled "The Santi-Panti Project." The Santi-Panti Project makes simple sanitary pads that promote good hygiene for young girls in Africa. Members of New Hope Church can help with this valuable project in three ways:

- a. Sew Santi-Panti pads; kits, created by New Hope Presbyterian Women, which include necessary fabric and directions, will be supplied.
- b. Donate girls' colored (not white) panties to use with the pads—please place donations in the labeled container on the right side of the narthex.
- c. Donate money to New Hope Presbyterian Women to send the finished project materials to the Michigan coordinator for "Little Dresses for Africa." Leave cash or check with Laurie in the church office. All checks should be made out to New Hope Presbyterian Church with 'Santi-Panti Project' on the memo line.
