## Pancake Breakfast & Formation Fair

On Sunday Sept.11, at 9:30 am, we will celebrate our third Church Family Gathering of 2016 to kick off the new year in Sunday School! In the Narthex, a "Formation Fair" with manned booths centered around important New Hope initiatives and our Adult Sunday School Classes will be open for you to visit! Representatives from both Adult Sunday School classes, "Contemporary Issues" and the "Inquiry Class" will share info about ongoing Formation opportunities in their classrooms too.

### A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR...



Striving to welcome, worship, grow, serve, and be God's love in the world. This is the slightly condensed version of our purpose statement and we see it each week on the back of our worship bulletin. The full version is, "The New Hope Presbyterian Church strives to welcome

and include all, worship God, grow in Christian faith, serve others, and be God's love in the world." Welcome, worship, grow, serve, and be God's love. That's what we strive to do and be and, as this edition of the New Hope Press reveals, there is a lot going on among us to help it all come alive.

The Journey began a new cycle in August and we have nine Travelers who are meeting weekly to ask questions, learn, pray, and rediscover the great mystery of God's love in their baptismal promises. It is a joy to meet with this group of Travelers, to hear their questions and be a part of the discussion. Some may unite with us in membership, but all will affirm the promises of God in their lives and their hopes to live after God's own heart and mind. I am grateful to Ruth Irvine, Linda Dencker, Terry Martinez, Del Phillips, Nancy Seals, Margo Van Mill and Lynn Harmon for serving on The Journey Leadership Team; to Margo Van Mill and Lynn Harmon for being our two small group leaders; to Nancy Seals and Donna Huffman for coordinating hospitality (meals) for our weekly gatherings; to Paul and Martha Hacker for helping to coordinate Companions; and to Jane Cox for serving as our Ministry Coordinator.

Our Earth Care Team has been working throughout the summer to conduct an "earth care audit" of our congregation so we can put measures in place to apply for credentialing as an Earth Care Congregation of the Presbyterian Church (USA). The credentialing, of course, is not an end in itself, but rather a means to further educate ourselves about the need to be good stewards of our environment and keep before us the need to continue working at preserving our natural resources in all we do. I am grateful to Cindy Martin for leading up this team, which is also served

by Mark Phillips, Nicole Faubert, Deb Garten, and Bob Dencker. If you are interested in learning more about the work of this team, any one of these people will be happy to talk with you.

The Sacred Conversations on Race Team has a new name—the Micah 6:8 Team. What began as a series of "sacred conversations" has grown into something more, something larger, as best described by the prophet Micah, chapter 6, verse 8: ...and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" The Micah 6:8 Team invited educators within our congregation to a conversation in July about their experiences of diversity within our schools, how it is handled and how we might advocate for justice, kindness and love for all in our educational environments. The work here continues and, because these are complex problems, the work is often slow. If we really do want to welcome and include all, as well as strive to be God's love in the world, like we say we do, then there is no way of getting around dealing with the issues at the heart of racial inequality in our communities. I am grateful to Jane Cox and Mary Powers for heading up this team and if you are interested in learning more, speak to either of them.

Our Church Family Gatherings have been a wonderful time of fellowship and formation. First on Palm Sunday and then on Pentecost, we have come together as a congregation to celebrate who we are as God's people. Our next Church Family Gathering is on Sunday, September 11<sup>th</sup>, as we share a pancake breakfast, enjoy an "open house" of our Sunday School classrooms and curricula, and learn about other ways we can invest ourselves in our ministry together. Many thanks go to Shelley Geiger, the Formation for Discipleship Team, and soooo many others for planning and executing these Gatherings. They have been a delight!

These, along with the other ministries of our congregation that are highlighted in these pages, give you a glimpse of just how we are striving to welcome, worship, grow, serve and be God's love in the world. I would love to hear more stories about how you are a part of it all!

Bounce House—and games for the kiddos!




# Rummage Sale

# Financial & Prayer Support for People in Louisana

Starting August 11, 2016, regions in Louisiana and Mississippi experienced 10-20 inches of rain. FEMA reports that there were 13 fatalities, over 8,000 people in shelters and over 10,000 residential and commercial structures affected.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance has reached out to the Presbytery of South Louisiana and the Presbytery of Mississippi to offer assistance. Three National Response Team members deployed to the Presbytery of South Louisiana on August 20th. An initial grant and a church damage grant has been sent to the Presbytery of South Louisiana.

Partnered with PDA, the group Washington Emergency Recovery Ongoing Cadre (W.E.R.O.C.) focuses on the needs of residents within Washington Parish. The recent floods have nearly exhausted the organization's resources. The group has spent the past three months helping get people back into their homes from March flooding.

"Now we're back to square one. We spent all of the funding we had to take care of the needs from the last flood including replacement of furniture and appliances," said Joe Kelley, CEO of W.E.R.O.C. "We're trying to find funds to get these folks back to their homes again."

Kelley says the biggest problem will be the emotional and spiritual counseling needed for those who are now going through this a second time in as many months. (from Presbyterian Disaster Assistance website)
