Advent and Christmas Music

The words of the hymn "Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus" were written by Charles Wesley and first published in 1744. As we sing these words, "...we enter into an ancient prayer. For hundreds of years, our ancestors in the faith prayed for the Messiah to come. God had blessed them to be a blessing to all the nations..., but it was difficult to feel blessed in the pain of defeat, exile, and occupation. They longed for the Messiah to come and reestablish the kingdom....While we have experienced times when God feels near, there are others seasons of struggle and doubt...We see the brokenness of our world and its systems...We await the day when Jesus will return to usher in the new creation and heal our broken world." We will sing of our hope as we long for that day during the Advent season. On December 2, the choir will sing "Our Hope Is in Emmanuel" and "Star of Heaven, Child of God."

The choir will sing "His Name Shall Be Called Peace" and "Prepare the Way," based upon texts from the book of Isaiah on December 9.

A Fifth Above Woodwind Quintet will return to play music of the season on December 16. Each of the talented members of this quintet is actively involved in performing ensembles throughout the region.



Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus, a concert of musical selections and readings from poetry, will be performed by the choir, handbell choir, and instrumentalists in a special service on Sunday, December 16 at 3:00 p.m.

On December 23, the choir will present an anthem called "Now the Heavens Start to Whisper," a poem by Mary Louise Bringle, as well as "Song of Mary" based on the Magnificat from the gospel of St. Luke.

The choir will sing two joyous pieces at the 11:00 p.m. Christmas Eve service, and a flute duet will play familiar Christmas songs.

Margret Heyl, violinist, will play Christmas selections on December 30. Margret is an instructor at Webster University Community Music School and plays in the Bach Society Orchestra.
