Music Notes

John Newton was an 18th century sea captain and slave trader. While on a voyage home, his ship was battered by a violent storm. He had not been a religious man, but this turn of events sparked the beginning of his spiritual conversion. His career in slave trading lasted a few years more until he quit going to sea altogether and began studying theology. Ordained in the Church of England in 1764, Newton became curate of Olney, where he struck up a friendship with poet William Cowper, who had undergone a similar spiritual conversion. Newton and Cowper began to write hymns. They organized a weekly prayer meeting for the people of Olney, attempting to present a poem or hymn for each prayer meeting.



The lyrics to Amazing Grace were written in late 1772 and were probably used in a prayer meeting for the first time on January 1, 1773.

The melody we generally associate with *Amazing Grace* is called NEW BRITAIN. This tune, like many other folk-inspired hymn tunes, may be a variant of a ballad originally from the British Isles. The text of *Amazing Grace*, written by Newton and joined with the NEW BRITAIN tune, appeared for the first time in William Walker's hymnal *Southern Harmony* in 1835.

Daylight saving time in the United States was first observed in 1918. Most areas of the United States currently observe daylight saving time, with the exceptions being the states of Arizona and Hawaii along with the territories of Puerto Rico, American Samoa, Guam, and the Northern Mariana Islands. Since 2007, daylight saving time starts on the second Sunday of March and ends on the first Sunday of November, with all time changes taking place at 2:00 AM (0200) local time. In 2018, daylight saving time ends on November 4th.
