At the August 6th meeting, the Session, upon recommendation of the Worship, Music & Arts and Formation for Discipleship Committees, approved a change to our Sunday morning schedule beginning on Sunday, September 9, 2018, with Christian Formation classes meeting from 9:15-10:00 am, followed by a time of fellowship and one service of worship at 10:15am.

Our current reality is that our overall average worship attendance can be well accommodated with one service of worship. And we believe that the best course of action at this time is to streamline our resources on Sunday morning (not just staff, but ushers, communion servers and sound booth volunteers, to name a few) and work to create other "points of contact" with our community for those who find themselves pulled in other directions on Sunday mornings.

We know that this decision may not please everyone, but we do hope that you will understand that we did not make this decision with haste. We also hope that you will make every effort to adjust to this change so that we may come together on Sunday mornings in our efforts to welcome and include all who yearn to encounter God in our weekly worship together.






Adult Education Opportunities

Covenant Bible Study

Covenant Bible Study is a 24-week study led by Chris James on Wednesday evenings. The theme of Covenant is foundational to our Presbyterian heritage and Reformed theology. It speaks to an enduring commitment between God and God's people. It is God's promise to live in a loving relationship with us as God's people in community. Three 8-episode segments each explore a different aspect of Covenant life. Each will examine what Covenant means, and the progression of a Covenant relationship with God.

The first 8-week segment, "Creating the Covenant" will go from September 19-November 14 (no meeting on Halloween, Wed., Oct. 31). We will then take a break for the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays, resuming with the second and third segments ("Living the Covenant" and "Trusting the Covenant") after the first of the year.

Dinner will be from 5:30-6:00 p.m. followed by Bible study from 6:00-7:20 p.m. After dinner, during the study, there will be separate activities for elementary-age children that explore the primary stories of the Bible in fun and interactive ways. Childcare will be available for children through Pre-K.

Chris James will lead the Bible study and Laurie Meinert will lead children's activities. The cost of the Covenant Bible Study is \$25.00, which covers materials for the entire 24-week study and is paid upon registration. The cost for dinner is \$5.00 per person, max. \$12.00 per family, and is paid each week.

Earth Care Garden a Success!

New Hope has delivered 110 pounds of produce to the Oasis Food Pantry as of mid-August! More produce is still ready to be picked in the upcoming weeks. This has been a terrific mission that used the hands, time and talent of many New Hope members. This project has been a wonderful blessing to all those who use the Oasis Food Pantry services.

The raised bed was built earlier this year by Todd Rasche, Greg Marshall, Bryan Eikmann, and Bill Irvine. Bryan Eikmann, Greg Marshall and Pat Tilk spread topsoil and compost mix to put the finishing touches on the garden. Greg Marshall made the beautiful Earth Care Garden sign that makes the garden space just pop and helps let people know where it is located. Chris James blessed the garden as part of the Earth Day celebration in April. Ruth Irvine, Bill Irvine and others planted the tomato plants and seeds for zucchini and green beans when the weather finally warmed in May.

Volunteers helped tend the garden all summer. Everyone's help is truly appreciated. The success of the garden was the result of everyone's efforts. Jennifer James, Diana Axetell and Bobbi Cusumano were faithful in the weekly watering effort. God helped by providing rain from time to time. Weeding was completed by Marty and Paul Hacker, Barb Newman, Dan Duggan, Todd and Liz Rasche and Marilyn Pavia. Landscape fabric is definitely going to be included in next year's budget as that seemed to help with the weeding process. Harvesting the vegetables which included weighing the bounty was accomplished by Paul and Marty Hacker, Leigh Lindahl Truett, Ruth Irvine, Bill Irvine, Cindy Martin, Marilyn Pavia and Todd and Liz Rasche.

There was much to be learned from this year's gardening experience. The green beans never established themselves even after being replanted two times. Blossom bottom rot was on some of the tomatoes which according to the internet is a result of a calcium deficiency in the soil and uptake in the water. The zucchini did very well, some getting very big in size -a few weighed in at over a pound. The size of the garden will remain the same for next year as it seemed to be manageable. All volunteers will be asked to provide input into what they thought about helping with the garden, what could have been done better, what worked for them and how could they make their job easier.

Leaves will be needed to place on the garden in the fall. The congregation will be asked to donate leaves in October.

It just has to be mentioned again that the success of the garden was the result of everyone's efforts. If you were asked to give advice, helped with any of the tasks or prayed for the garden - you are a part of this mission's success. The Earth Care Team and Oasis Food Pantry thank each and every one of you. Let's keep it going and get ready for next year

Music Notes

In the previous newsletter issue, we looked at the author Isaac Watts (1674-1748). Watts is regarded as one of the finest English-language hymn writers of all time. "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross", "Joy to the World", "Jesus Shall Reign Where'er the Sun", and "Alas, And Did My Savior Bleed" are but a few of his well-known hymns.

The next important hymn writer after Watts was Charles Wesley (1707-1788). Charles and his brother John were students at Oxford University. They undertook a very strict regimen of worship and discipline, from which they received a nickname, "Methodists." Charles Wesley wrote over 6000 hymns, including "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling", "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing", "O For a Thousand Tongues to Sing", and "Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus." In next month's Music Notes, you can read John Wesley's directions for hymn singing. Although written in the 18th century, his instructions are applicable today.

If you like to sing, and can commit to weekly Wednesday evening rehearsals and Sunday morning worship, we hope you will join the choir. Please contact Gay if you will be a new singer, so that you can be added to the contact list and so we have copies of music for you. (gspears@nhpres.org).
